



No. 855 Wood Mitre Instructions For Use

This tool works best on soft woods such as pine or MDF. Hardwoods like oak have hard spots that can break blades.




Cut with bottom handle grip against floor for increased leverage and support. Commit and cut all the way through. Partial cuts get stuck on blade. Do not twist the wood off. Most cuts are made with radius facing the blade (exception: square inside corner).

MITER CORNERS: SQUARE OUTSIDE











SQUARE INSIDE















TIP: NOTCHED BACK CORNERS ELIMINATE GAPPING


"SOFT" OUTSIDE













BLADE CHANGE:

WARNING: blades are sharp!



4. Insert new blade, and replace bushing. Replace bottom handle. Re-insert carriage bolt, and tighten nut.
